

When the customer called to say that he received the wrong gates, a quick video search of the shipment being loaded from the warehouse onto the delivery truck verified that the right inventory was delivered.

"Without the video, a successful resolution would not have been as easy. We did not have to return to the delivery site simply to verify what was loaded onto the truck. We were able to see for ourselves that the proper products were shipped. The video gave us more credibility and assurance in discussions with our customer. And the customer was reassured knowing that we had the video."

As it turned out, the gates that Conlin delivered were, in fact, missing its handles. But again, video solved the problem. "We called our supplier, who then checked their video and saw that they sent the wrong merchandise to us. Without video, this situation could have lasted days - or even longer."
