




Voting Instructions for Voting in Fulton County

Ask for Assistance.






Sign in with the election inspectors. The inspector will then give voters their ballot, along with a privacy sleeve.



Voters will then proceed to the private ballot marking station.



Voters **MUST** fill out their ballots with the flair marker provided. The ballots work much like filling out a lotto ticket.



4. Review and Scan

VOTE
