Uniquely situated on 176 acres in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains in northeast Georgia, Camp Toccoa has forested trails, waterfalls, high & low ropes courses, a lake, a swimming pool, a nature center, the historic Tasnena lodge, and a state-of-the-art riding stable.



Our coed programs for young people entering the first through twelfth grades offer a variety of fun and challenging activities. Our energetic are dedicated to helping campers learn about themselves and the natural world around them. All stall have First Aid and CPR certification and attend an intensive training program prior to each summer.

Since 1927, Camp Toccoa has been a summer home to thousands of youth. Campers have a wonderful time in a safe and supportive environment. We encourage campers to explore, discover, and become independent through a variety of activities.



## SUMMER FUN

Our **TRADITIONAL CAMP** is a classic summer camp. Campers choose activities such as arts & crafts, swimming, archery, canoeing, dance & drama, environmental education, climbing, and sports & games. Horseback riding is available for a small additional fee. Afternoons are spent hiking to waterfalls, swimming in the pool, and playing games with cabin-mates. Traditional camp runs all summer in both one and two week sessions.

**HORSEBACK CAMPS** focus on riding skills and the principles of caring for and partnering with a horse. Campers spend the day learning all aspects of horsemanship from horse and barn management to developing and perfecting handling and riding skills.



There's a bit of adventurer in all our campers, but for those who want to take it to the next level, our **ADVENTURE CAMP** is perfect!

Campers challenge themselves on our High and Low Ropes Courses, practice living and cooking outdoors, and learn to work together as a team. This camp is available in two themes:

**HIGH ADVENTURE-** An exciting combination of indoor and outdoor climbing, campers will have a blast while learning all the fundamental skills of rock climbing and challenging themselves on our high ropes course.

**CAROLINA QUEST-** Spend a few days at camp and then set off for the adventure of a lifetime. This two-week combination of backpacking, rock climbing and whitewater rafting will teach campers the skills needed to see the best of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

**EVENINGS** are filled with fun "all-camp" activities. These include camp fires, dances, pool parties, and themed parties such as pirate night and gold rush. Every camper will have the opportunity to cook

out over a fire and sleep under the stars. Each session culminates in a traditional Council Fire where campers and counselors reflect on their time together.

Older teens can gain leadership skills while having fun in our **LEADERS-IN-TRAINING (LIT)** and **COUNSELOR-IN-TRAINING (CIT)** programs. These programs focus on the skills and responsibilities of becoming a camp counselor. Teens interested in the CIT Program should request an application and interview with the camp director.
