SL: Can psychometric tests really help you in finding that ideal career you've been looking for?

Want to know which Peanuts character you are? What trendy automobile brand is best suited for your personality? Or where in between the geek-stud scale you stand? The growing popularity of personality quizzes has given rise to every conceivable quiz possible - both for irrelevant entertainment and those looking for a serious evaluation. While establishing whether you're domineering Lucy or an intense Schroeder may be seemingly innocuous - according to some of these psychometric evaluations, it may give you a better insight on your ideal educational or career choice. There's a growing presence of legitimate psychological, personality and career tests that can help you in picking a university course or a career that doesn't make you want to give yourself a lobotomy. Of course, life would be wholly simpler if we were told of our ideal career paths by the stork that delivered us as a new-born. Just eight quick questions and you are given suggestions on possible career and course options.

The **Keirsey Temperament Sorter** is a well-established personality instrument that has been co-opted by organizations around the world. While a more detailed analysis will cost you, there's an option to ascertain your temperament type, acquire a brief analysis of your traits and what vocations are natural to your type. The seventy-one initial questions shouldn't take you more than 15 minutes, and you get to determine which of the distinct sixteen groups you belong to. By understanding whether you're an ENFP (Idealist - Champion) or an INTJ (Rational - Mastermind), you've taken a baby-step in understanding more about yourself. The exciting thing

about understanding your temperament type is the myriad other resources now available over the Internet to further examine and analyze these various groups.

Jung purported that the human behavior was predictable and classifiable and NOT random; that we were all predisposed to particular personality traits. This belief gave rise to the **Myers-Briggs Indicator (MBTI)**, the foremost psychometric evaluation, and after fifty-years it's still considered the leader in its field.
