A lockdown procedure will be used in an attempt to minimize the risk of violence and increase the safety of each chapter and its members by restricting access and visibility by a threatening person or event internal or external to all chapters.

- 1. When you hear, "**LOCKDOWN**" from a member of the Fraternity and Sorority Affairs or a university official:
 - i. Everyone is to stay where they are.
 - ii. Quickly glance outside the house and rooms to direct any members into the house or room immediately.
 - iii. Lock your doors.
 - 1. If your doors do not lock, barricade the doors with tables, chairs or whatever is available.
 - iv. Lower or close any blinds.
 - v. Turn out lights and computer monitors.
 - vi. Keep members and guests quiet.
 - vii. Stay low to the ground.
 - viii. Turn all cell phones on silent mode. Do not make nonessential calls.
- 2. Stay in safe areas until directed by emergency personnel or a Fraternity and Sorority Affairs Crisis Team member to move or evacuate. Never open doors during a lockdown, even in the event of a fire alarm. For further directives, emergency personnel and crisis team officials will make announcements to the house (use the intercom system if the chapter has one).
- 3. Fraternity and Sorority Affairs will signal all chapters if the lockdown has been lifted.
- 4. An emergency personnel will direct all chapter members to a safe location if an evacuation occurs. Once evacuated from the chapter house, chapter executives should take roll to account for all members present in the house.

If Outside of chapter house during Lockdown:

Hide – Go inside the nearest building. If you cannot safely get inside a building, use bushes, trees, walls, and benches for cover.

Run – Make it safely out of the area if you think you can. If you decide to run, do not run in a straight line. Try to keep objects, such as trees, garbage cans, buildings and cars between you and the hostile person.

Play Dead – If you are unable to run or hide from the intruder, you may choose to lie on the ground and lay as still as possible.

Caught – If you are caught by the intruder, obey all commands and avoid eye contact. Obey all commands of emergency personnel when they arrive and take over the situation.



First aid will be used in an attempt to increase the safety and knowledge of each chapter and its members by keeping members informed of what to do in emergency situations in chapter houses or on campus.

Each chapter should have a Phone Directory of all members. Make sure the president is at the top of the list. The president should been the main emergency contact for members.

- 1. If serious injury or illness occurs on the chapter's grounds, immediately dial 9-1-1. Give your name; describe the nature and severity of the medical problem and the location of the victim.
- 2. Contact the chapter's president if he or she is not present at the time of the emergency.
- 3. Call the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs to report the situation.
- 4. In case of minor injury or illness, trained personnel should quickly perform the following steps:
 - i. Keep the victim still and comfortable. Do not move the victim.
 - ii. Ask victim, "Are you okay?" and "What is wrong?"
 - iii. Check breathing and give CPR if necessary.
 - iv. Control serious bleeding by direct pressure on the wound with available supplies.
 - v. If medical help is needed, call University Health Services at (405) 744-7665 (for minor injuries) or 9-1-1 (for serious injuries) and continue to assist the victim until help arrives.
 - vi. Wait for medical personnel to reach the victim. When paramedics arrive, provide them with all of the information they need.

Each chapter should have a First Aid kit in the house. Make sure the First Aid kit is stored in an easily accessible location. First Aid kit should include:

- 1. Adhesive bandages (assorted sizes)
- 2. Adhesive cloth tape
- 3. Antibiotic ointment packets
- 4. Antiseptic wipe packets
- 5. Packets of aspirin
- 6. One space blanket
- 7. Non-latex gloves
- 8. Scissors
- 9. Roller bandages
- 10. Sterile gauze pads
- 11. Oral thermometer (non-mercury/non-glass)
- 12. Tweezers
- 13 First aid instructional booklet



Mental health procedure will be used in an attempt to know how to recognize signs of distress and take the appropriate action, minimize the risk of violence and increase the safety of each chapter and its members when persons inside or outside the chapter need counseling or may become a risk to others or themselves.

Balancing the pressures of school, work, personal life, student organizations and obligations of Greek members can lead to high levels of stress. Members are encouraged to seek outlets to help manage their stress.

Suicide Intervention:

Approximately 1,088 suicides occur on college campuses each year, and one in 12 college students have made a suicide plan.

Typical warning signs:

- 1. Overtly suicidal statements
- 2. Giving away prized possessions
- 3. Anxiety
- 4. Depression
- 5. Radical change in behavior
- 6. Ambivalence about the future

Reasons to Seek Counseling:

- 1. Feel as if you have no direction in life
- 2. Pick what seem to be the "wrong" friends
- 3. Feel stressed out or anxious
- 4. Don't know how to study
- 5. Feel like you can't go on
- 6. Drink heavily or use drugs
- 7. Feels stressed about being away from home
- 8. Eat too much or too little
- 9. Can't decide on major





The active shooter procedure will be used in an attempt to minimize the risk of deadly harm and increase the safety of each chapter and its members by restricting access and visibility when there is imminent threat by persons internal or external to all chapters.

At first report of an active shooter on the Oklahoma State campus follow these steps:

- 1. If you witness the altercation call 9-1-1 immediately.
- 2. If you receive a CODE RED message follow the given instructions.
- 3. The Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs will gather into the designated Crisis Control Center if reasonably possible, or evacuate if a safer place is available.
 - a. Offices are usually in the basement; therefore lock the doors, lock yourself into an interior office; anything away from windows where you cannot be seen.
- 4. Using the CODE RED and any other information available, Ival Gregory will begin the calling tree.
- 5. Ival Gregory will call all fraternity presidents. Liz Osborne will call all sorority presidents.
 - a. If presidents cannot be reached, the housing director or risk management officer will be called.
 - b. Chapter officers will be instructed to lock down their houses.
 - i. The chapter houses need to go on lockdown. Most chapter houses have special codes on the doors, only allowing members to enter.
 - ii. Members should be allowed to enter, but not leave unless necessary.
 - iii. Dependant on the situation, members should stay away from open windows and close the blinds or curtains.
 - iv. Chapters should follow their active shooter guidelines.
- 6. Ival and Liz will stay in contact with the OSU and/or Stillwater police departments in order to remain updated on the situation.
 - a. Ival and Liz will keep fraternity and sorority presidents updated with the most recent information available.

Once the threat is under control and the police have given the all clear,

Ival and Liz will call all chapters and relay necessary information.



Severe weather procedure will be used in an attempt to minimize the risk of injury or death and increase the safety of each chapter and its members.

If you are on the Oklahoma State campus during a normal working day, you are responsible for finding shelter in the event of a natural disaster.

- 1. When the weather is threatening a tornado, get yourself and anyone in your company to the nearest building with a basement.
 - a. Listen for sirens. If they go off, do everything in your power to get to a safe place in the building you are already in.
 - b. If you are in the Fraternity and Sorority Affairs office, you are probably already in a basement.
 - i. Turn off unnecessary electrical equipment.
 - ii. Stay away from glass windows and close any doors.
 - iii. Use telephones for emergency calls only.
- 2. Turn on the local news or use a computer to find the latest information regarding the weather situation. If a radio is available, tune in to KOSU-FM (91.7 MHz), KSPI-FM (93.7 MHz), KVRO-FM (98.1 MHz) or KGFY-FM (105.5 MHz)
- 3. Account for everyone in the chapter house or office. If anyone is missing, call and make sure they are safe and aware of the situation.
 - a. Call Physical plant to report any damage (405) 744-7154.
- 4. If a tornado touches down on campus or anywhere near the Greek chapter houses, Ival Gregory will begin the calling tree.
 - a. Ival Gregory will call the fraternity presidents.
 - b. Liz Osborne will call the sorority presidents.
 - c. If the presidents do not answer, the house director or risk management officer will receive notification.
 - d. Fraternity and Sorority Affairs officers will be checking to make sure each chapter can account for all of its members and to make sure there is no damage to chapter houses.
 - i. In the event that a chapter member has been injured or is not responding, the chapter should enact their emergency policies, or do whatever possible to find the member
- 5. Once all chapter members are accounted for, continue to monitor weather conditions.

Poison, alcohol and drug procedures will be used in an attempt to minimize the risk of injury or death and increase the safety of each chapter and its members by being aware of warning signs and emergency response procedures in the event of alcohol poisoning or drug abuse.

Any person that has altered consciousness, slowed respiration, repeated, uncontrolled vomiting, or cool, pale skin is experiencing acute alcohol intoxication (alcohol poisoning). This is a medical emergency and you MUST get help. Call 9-1-1 immediately.

- 1. Call 9-1-1
- 2. Stay with the person and wake him or her up frequently. Even though the person is sleeping, alcohol levels may continue to rise, causing the person to become unconscious, rather than asleep.
- 3. If the person is lying down, turn the person on his or her side and use a pillow to keep the person from rolling out of position. Vomiting could cause the person to choke.
- 4. Check the person's skin and breathing patterns. If the skin is bluish, pale, cold or clammy, get help immediately. If the person has more than eight seconds between each breath, get help.
- 5. Do not leave the person alone. Be able to tell details to emergency responders.
- 6. Call Ival Gregory to report the incident.

DO	DO NOT
Continue to monitor the intoxicated person.	Give the person food, liquids, medication or drugs to sober him/her up.
Check the person's breathing and wake him or her often.	Give the person a cold shower; the shock of the cold could cause unconsciousness.

For this and all other possible instances of poisoning:

If the person is conscious, call 800-222-1222, and you'll automatically be routed to your local poison control center. The staff at the poison control center or emergency call center can instruct you as to whether you should take the person directly to a hospital. All calls to poison control centers are confidential.



Gas leak, flooding and power outage procedure will be used in an attempt to minimize the risk injury and increase the safety of each chapter and its members. If you smell a garlic-like odor or suspect a gas leak:

- 1. Do not touch any electrical switches.
- 2. Put out and don't use any type of fire (cigarette, candle, stove).
- 3. Open windows and doors for ventilation.
- 4. If smell is overwhelming, evacuate the building.
- 5. Dial 9-1-1 and remain outdoors until OSU Police arrive.

If you experience an uncontrollable flood:

- Stop using all electrical devices.
- Notify physical plant (405) 744-7154 (Monday-Friday 7 a.m.-10 p.m.)
- Notify OSU Police (405) 744-7154 (weekends and after 10 p.m.)
- Evacuate the building.

Power Outage:

It is important to prepare for a power outage by placing flashlights and emergency supplies in a familiar place.

- 1. Check the fuse box for a blown fuse or damaged circuit breaker.
- 2. Unplug all large appliances before replacing a fuse or breaker.
- 3. Call neighboring Greek houses to see if they are without power.
- 4. Notify physical plant (405) 744-7154 (Monday-Friday 7a.m.-10p.m.)
- 5. Notify OSU Police (405) 744-6523 (weekends and after 10p.m.)

A bomb threat procedure will be used in an attempt to minimize the risk of injury or death and increase the safety of each chapter and its members through knowing the procedure to take when receiving a bomb threat and increasing the safety of those in or surrounding the building or area.


In the event of a bomb threat on campus:

- 1. Stay where you are unless informed otherwise by Fraternity and Sorority Affairs or emergency personnel
- 2. Ival Gregory is notified first.
 - a. Ival Gregory will notify Liz Osborne.
 - Liz Osborne will notify Council graduate assistants and others in the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs to update the website, Twitter and Facebook
 - c. Graduate Assistants will notify Council presidents and House Mothers of chapters on campus.
 - d. Council Presidents and Vice Presidents should contact assigned chapter presidents
- 3. All fraternities and sororities should follow chapter crisis plans unless otherwise informed by Ival Gregory, Liz Osborne or Council presidents.
- 4. Do not evacuate until instructed to do so by Fraternity and Sorority Affairs or emergency personnel
- 5. Do not contact Ival Gregory or Liz Osborne unless there is an added emergency


If you receive a bomb threat, take these actions:

- 1. Remain calm, be courteous, listen and do not interrupt the caller. Pay attention to what the caller says.
- 2. Take notes if possible. (See Bomb Threat Checklist)
 - a. If you have caller ID, write down the number of the incoming call.
 - b. Write down the exact words of the caller and the threat.
- 3. Do not hang up the phone. Leave the line open.
- 4. Get the attention of another person. Pass a note or relay a message of what is going on.
- 5. Have another person call **9-1-1**
- 6. Notify Ival Gregory.
- 7. Do NOT touch any suspicious packages.
- 8. Write down information as it is given and have other person inform the police and Ival Gregory
- 9. Try to keep the caller on the phone.
 - a. Listen for background noises, accents, or anything memorable that could help place the origin of the call.
- 10. Have a plan for how you will alert people occupying the building.
- 11. Evacuate the building when instructed by emergency personnel.

It is the official policy of the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs at Oklahoma State University that members of Greek affiliation should maintain a "no comment" strategy. If a media representative approaches or requests information from a chapter member, the member should politely refuse to comment and refer the professional to Ival Gregory.

In case of widespread rumors or other Greek community related crises that capture media attention, the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs will inform each chapter president as to the appropriate course of action.



Sexual assault procedure will be used in an attempt to minimize the risk of violence and increase the safety of chapter members in the event of threatening persons inside or outside the chapter houses.

In the event of a sexual assault, take these actions:


- 1. If you are being attacked
 - a. Make a scene- Scream as loud as possible to try to gain the attention of others around you
 - b. Fight your attacker if safe to do so
 - c. Try to escape- if possible, divert the attention of the attacker or throw him off guard
 - d. If able to escape, get to a safe place
 - e. Notify the police or call **9-1-1**
 - i. Use one of the "blue" emergency telephones on campus or phones in the Greek community if needed
- 2. If you have been sexually assaulted
 - a. Get to a safe place
 - b. Do not clean up- you may have evidence on you
 - c. Seek medical attention
 - d. Call 911 and report the incident
 - e. Ival Gregory is notified first
 - i. Ival Gregory will notify Liz Osborne and follow the procedure if deemed necessary
 - Liz Osborne will notify Council graduate assistants and others in the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs to update the website, Twitter and Facebook
 - 2. Graduate Assistants will notify Council presidents and House Mothers of chapters on campus.
 - 3. Council Presidents and Vice Presidents should contact assigned chapter president




In the event of assault and battery, take these actions:

- 1. If you are being physically attacked
 - a. Make a scene- Scream as loud as possible to try to gain the attention of others around you
 - a. Fight your attacker if safe to do so

 - c. Immediately notify the police or call **9-1-1**
