WHY “GREEN” JOBS AREN’T ALWAYS “SAFE” JOBS

Normal, IL – World Wide Director of Industrial Hygiene and Occupational Toxicologist, Donna Heidel, will be an essential speaker for the Illinois State Science and Technology Week, April 12th – 16th. This session will discuss the benefits of going green in a sustainable community, but not always safe for the workers performing this “green” job.

“Just as the sustainability of society depends on the environment, the strength of our economy depends on a safe and healthy workforce,” says Heidel. “To prevent occupational injuries, illnesses, and fatalities through the inclusion of prevention principles in all designs that impact workers.”
