### Comments (Please elaborate on strengths/areas for growth):

Mr. MacNay uses the Nip.U. template to create highly detailed lesson plans that will provide a wide variety of learning experiences for his students. He draws heavily on his musical talent and experiences as a performer and music therapist to enrich his lessons, building on prior instruction and experiences of the students. He plans for a variety of activities to motivate students and to develop both their knowledge of music and skill on their instruments;he has prepared and will use a checklist on which to record student performances of their three chord songs. After performing his NEW COMPOSITION created about this class, to the tune of "The House of the Rising Sun", he will discuss plagiarism and a suit Joe Satriani brought against Cold Play. The consolidation will consist of the students playing the pattern of the song in question and discussing whether the suit had merit.

## Comments (Please elaborate on strengths/areas for growth):

Mr. MacNay spontaneously used the playing of the Libyan National Anthem during opening exercises to revisit the chords students had been learning. Students were able to identify the chords without ever hearing the anthem previously. He effectively used large group instruction, often playing and singing to demonstrate, and bounding around the room, then wheeling on the desk chair, interacting and accompanying small groups and individuals as they practised and performed. The work of those who performed their three chord songs was recorded on a checklist. His talents, singing and playing the guitar, were the most effective "technical resources"; the blackboard was used effectively to identify chords learned, as was the computer/projector for the Satriani/Cold Play component. He is attentive to time and to the class's rhythm.

Mr.MacNay draws on the "power of the music" to engage his students. He uses his voice, songs, and guitar work to model communications and to give students the confidence to perform. Exchanges between teacher and students are positive and productive; the environment is safe,respectful,and highly collaborative. Management practices are subtle, based upon his observations of student conduct and are being effective. Students were thanked for their contriutions; the class was commended for its success and co-operation. The whole experience was positive, from when they walk in the door, to, at the end, being asked what the class wants him to prepare for his return.
