Packers Players to Auction off Super Bowl XLV Gear for Charity Money Collected Will Benefit Local Schools

GREEN BAY, Wis - February 4, 2011. Several Green Bay Packers players, such as Aaron Rodgers, Greg Jennings, and Clay Matthews will be auctioning off various game-worn gear to raise money for The Green Bay Packers Foundation. The items to be auctioned off include: Aaron Rodgers' helmet, Greg Jennings' cleats, and Clay Matthews' jersey. The auction will be held from noon to 5 P.M. at Lambeau Field on Friday, Feb. 11. Tickets to the auction will cost \$5. Items being auctioned off are expected to sell from \$20 to over \$1,000.

The money will be used to benefit local schools by buying new educational equipment and supplies. Many of the local schools lack adequate access to computers and updated textbooks. By donating money and supplies to these schools, the Green Bay Packers will ensure that students will be able to be competitive with students from around the country.
