Last Saturday the Harvey Milk LGBT Democratic Club held a debate between State Senate candidates Joe Alioto Veronese, Carole Migden, and Mark Leno. Eager to see the expected catfight between Migden and Leno, I was surprised that Joe Alioto Veronese gained the support of the audience and proved to be the better candidate.

One of Joe Alioto Veronese's biggest advocacies is for Universal Health Care. When addressing the issue, he stated that we ought to "completely eliminate the insurance companies."
