Oklahoma State University to build new performing arts center

Stillwater, Okla.— Oklahoma State plans to hold a black-tie benefit gala at 8 p.m. on Nov. 15, on the corner of Knoblock and University streets. The benefit gala will be a concert featuring local artists and Oklahoma State University alumni such as All American Rejects, country singers Garth Brooks and Adley Stump, along with a soprano singer for the Seattle Opera, Sarah Coburn.

Oklahoma State University Foundation is coordinating a campaign to raise funds in support of the construction of a new performing arts center. The foundation invites donors and alumni to attend the event at the site of the future groundbreaking. Jason Caniglia, the Foundation's associate vice president for development, has set his sights high.

“This new facility will produce music that will be heard at a national level,” Caniglia said. “The gala will be an excellent event that will acknowledge the success of the past and encourage the talent of the future.”

Funding for the project will be provided through the OSU Branding Success Campaign. The project will be completely funded by private donors, so students should see no increase in student fees.

Oklahoma State University fundraising gala.

What: Oklahoma State University plans to build a state-of-the-art performing arts center.

The foundation will host a black-tie fundraising gala on the evening of Nov. 15, at the corner of Knoblock and University streets, where the new performing arts center will be built. The gala will be a benefit concert, featuring successful alumni such as Garth Brooks, Sarah Coburn and Adley Stump.

Who: The OSU Department of Music is currently located in the Seretean Center for the Performing Arts, built in the 1970s. The music department is working with the OSU Foundation to raise money for the new project.

Where: The black-tie fundraising gala will be held on the field where the new performing arts center will be built, on the corner of Knoblock and University streets.

When: The gala will be at 8 p.m. on Nov. 15.

Seretean Center for the Performing Arts

The Seretean Center for Performing Arts has housed the department of music since 1970. This facility includes a 600-seat theater and a 900-seat concert hall. Students have access to a music multi-media lab, practice rooms and spaces for studio, classroom and instrument instruction.

Degrees included in the music department are the following: music education, music with elective studies business, music performance and music. Master's programs are offered in pedagogy and performance.

The music department offers professional, hands-on learning. Students can participate in more than 15 large and chamber ensembles. Throughout the year, there are more than 150 concerts and recitals. These shows are presented by students, faculty and guest artists who are known nationally and internationally.

The school is fully accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music. Oklahoma State University gained the title in 2008 of an All-Steinway School with the purchase of 30 new Steinway Pianos.

The OSU Department of Music offers free admissions to concerts presented by faculty, guests and students. Large ensemble concert ticket prices are \$8 for general admission and \$6 for seniors and students. Special concerts, such as the president's concert, are priced at \$10 for reserved seating and \$8 for students.
