#### **OSU** announces plans for new performing arts center

Stillwater, Okla.—Oklahoma State University will construct a new performing arts center. Jason Caniglia, associate vice president for development, announced that the center will be constructed south of campus on the corner of Fourth and Hester streets. Construction begins Oct. 18, 2012.

"We are building this performing arts center to give music majors an opportunity to showcase their talent," Caniglia said. "The center will also be a great recruitment tool for the university."

The center will be the music department's new home, which currently resides in the Seretean Center with OSU's theatre department. The new center will give the two departments separate homes and allow both to focus on their own needs.

Funds for the center come from private donors and OSU alumni. Funds do not come from the university or the state of Oklahoma.

"We will update students, faculty and the Stillwater community as construction begins to progress," Caniglia said.
